She is looking at two of each type of bird's egg that cover all our member's different varieties/species. We can use this going forward both as an exercise in egg recognition and as a record of the different bird types within the club. There will be a sheet of paper on the club table/notice board which will have listed all bird types known to be in the club and also what eggs are currently covered and obviously what are still needed. Feel free to talk with Helen about this for further information or with your donations. Remember this is a long-term task – we are asking this now so people will have it in their heads to save some eggs that would otherwise be thrown away.

<u>Breeding Season & Going on HolidayTips.</u> NB. It's Guy Fawkes soon, so leave a night light on, close any birdroom windows/curtains & if your birds are used to a radio going by day, make sure it is on the night of November 5th!

- 1) Check your birds have constant access to fresh clean water.
- 2) Ensure greenfood is 'spray-free' and removed before it has a chance to go stale.
- 3) Keep your pre-mixed softfood in the fridge.

4) Birds love to bathe so keep a shallow container handy for this purpose but be careful it isn't so full that there is a risk of chicks drowning in it.

5) Clean river sand is good for birds to pick through and even 'dust-bathe' in.

6) Keep a special watch out for traditional threats to adults & chicks such as cats at night, mite, mosquitoes, sudden noises, excessive heat etc.

- 7) Before going on holiday, arrange for a reliable person to care for your birds.
- 8) Before you go, check your aviary, breeding cages etc for any damage/holes.
- 9) Check the locks on your birdroom/aviary.

10) Leave a clear list for the carer along with your cellphone number.

Breeding Season Tips Part 2

- 1) Observe your birds' behaviour even more than normal
- 2) Avoid sudden movements or introducing strangers into your birdroom near any sitting hen
- 3) Hovering blowflies often mean dead chicks, so check the young frequently
- 4) Check cage floors frequently as chicks may fall out but can still be revived by a warm hand & gentle breathing on them
- 5) Keep to regular feeding times & a late feed will keeps chicks topped up overnight
- 6) Keep accurate ring records
