Another year and another show season comes to a close. The Grand Nationals were held this year in Christchurch and saw a total of 1142 birds benched. Some Kapiti members made the long trip south. Tom & Nola Edser came away with Best AA Border and Barry Dwyer won Best Novice Yorkshire Canary and earned himself a Silver medal for his efforts. We came away with a mixed bag of prizes so the trip south was worth it. Best CYCR Cockatiel in two out of three classes, 2nd Best CYCR overall, 4th and 5th Best Cockatiel overall out of a field of nineteen.. On the Finch side, 3rd, 5th and 7th Best behind Dave Nicholson's Green Singer (again!! It won in Napier a few years back as well) and a Gouldian Finch. Interestingly, there were four quails on the bench – one Chinese and three Japanese – all from South Island breeders - and four Doves. It was nice to see a variety of non-hookbeaks on the bench for a change, although disappointing that the overall number count was so low. Many of the big showing members from the North Island did not make the trip south, so this was to be expected.

Congratulations to all winners and to the Christchurch Club for putting on a great show. For those interested, the Grand National next year is another South Island affair with the Timaru Club hosting the 2018 show. Plenty of time to start thinking about it and saving up ©
