There will be a copy of these on the table beside the name tags for those who are interested. The Federation comes out every two months and other clubs monthly.

Handy Hints

#1 Place a leaf of Aloe Vera plant in the birds drinking water. Replace after you clean the dish, leave for at least a week. Not only does it worm them, but also gives them all of the vitamins that they need.

#2 Use Essential Peppermint Oil (1 drop per 10mls of water) to deter Mice and all crawling insects including ants. Spray nest boxes and walls of cages and house areas.

#3 Save eggshells (well cleaned) and bake in the microwave for 2-3 min. Crush and mix with grated cuttlefish bone.

#4 Feed Bee Pollen in February to help with body and feather growth. Mix with seed or add to soft food.

#5 Bay Tree leaves placed in seed storage or hoppers help deter codling moth.
